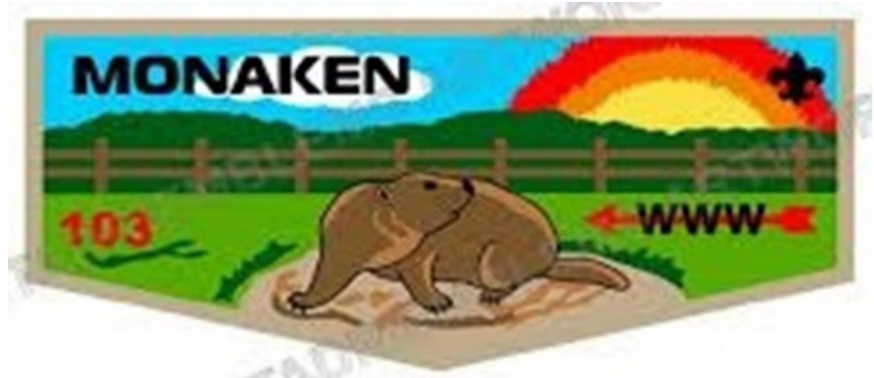

It isn't all work :-) Every day there are games and vendor displays,,,,,oh and a pizza party for you and 8000 of your closest friends!!! Every night there is a professionally produced show based on the fundamental beliefs of our Order. You can meet Brothers from every state and trade patches until you can't trade any more. We are currently accepting advance registrations for NOAC. The fee (without transportation costs) are \$450. This includes lodging in a dorm room, three meals a day (each meal has a choice of three different meals) and a special red OA sash that only participants of the 100th Anniversary NOAC receive.

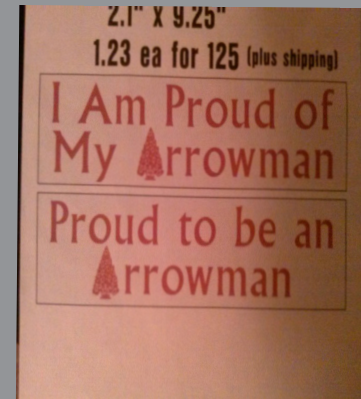

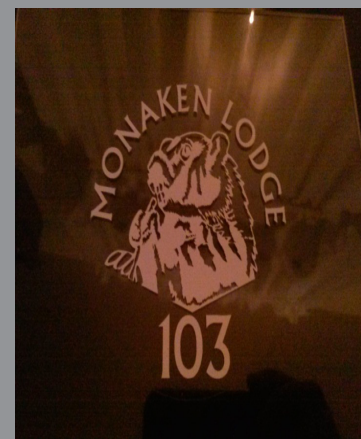

Ceremonies

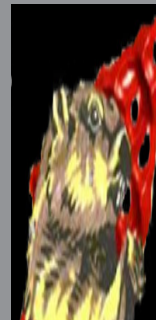

WOODROW INSTITUTE



Registration is now open for the Woodrow Institute, a youth oriented training weekend to be held at Seven Mountains Scout Camp March 21-23, 2014. The event is sponsored by Monaken Lodge. Woodrow Institute is designed to offer youth the opportunity to learn practical skills through classroom and hands on instruction. Classes will be taught by past Lodge members, current youth leaders, and adults. This will be an annual event allowing the youth to advance their training from year to year. Each unit currently has two spots for youth guaranteed to them through February 22. After the 22nd, unclaimed spaces will be available for all units to send additional Scouts. However, spots are only secure once full payment is received. Each unit must send at least one adult if Scouts will be attending from your unit. Registration can be noted online.

Alertness to the needs of others is the mark of the Vigil Honor. It calls for an individual with an unusual awareness of the possibilities within each situation.

The Vigil Honor is the highest honor that the Order of the Arrow can bestow upon its members for service to lodge, council, and Scouting. Membership cannot be won by a person's conscious endeavors.

The Vigil Honor is a high mark of distinction and recognition reserved for those Arrowmen who, by reason of exceptional service, personal effort, and unselfish interest, have made distinguished contributions beyond the immediate responsibilities of their position of office to one or more of the following: Lodge, Order of the Arrow, Scouting Community, and Scout Camp.
